### SECTIONS

1. **General.** Live firing conducted at the MKGC Indoor Range is designed to provide authorized personnel access to a facility where they can become proficient with privately owned firearms.
2. **Facilities for Use.** The Management schedules range availability. Live-fire shooting is normally limited to rifles and pistols of any caliber or gauge approved by management, except. tracers or armor-piercing ammunition. In addition thereto the Management will from time to time publish or post signs indicating any limitations of live fire.
3. **Range Limitations and Safety Requirements.** Live-fire shooters and guests will:
  - a. Fire only with a Range Safety Officer (RSO) present, unless qualified to use the range without supervision.
  - b. Fire only authorized firearms and ammunition.
  - c. Fire at authorized targets only.
  - d. Fire only after completing a "Hold Harmless" agreement. (Renewal is required annually for members. Guests must complete a "Hold Harmless" agreement each visit.)
  - e. Ensure all projectiles impact within the established range backstops.
  - f. Call "Cease firing" and make safe all firearms when a shooter moves forward of the firing line or during any unsafe condition.
  - g. Call "Cease firing" if a firing line becomes staggered (one shooter forward of another) anywhere on the range complex except in tactical or law enforcement training authorized by management.
  - h. Use appropriate ear protection. Double hearing protection (earplugs and ear muffs) is recommended on the indoor range.
  - i. Wear appropriate eye protection.
  - j. Notify the Club Executive Officer or Chief Range Safety Officer (CRSO) of any safety infractions.

- k. Police all brass, paper, and other debris that accumulates on the range. Dispose of them in the containers provided. Members are allowed to pick up their own brass as long as it lands on the safe side of the firing line.
4. **Authorized & Prohibited Firearms-** Class 3 firearms and devices are permitted, i.e., (fully automatic firearms) only with permission of the management.
  5. **Authorized Personnel.** The following persons are allowed to fire without a Range Safety Officer posted:
    - a. Current members of the club after attending a range safety briefing and being certified.
    - b. Invited guests of the above, provided the sponsoring member is present and assumes full responsibility for the conduct of his or her guest(s). Guests must complete a "Hold Harmless" agreement prior to entering the range.
    - c. Personnel approved by the management or CRSO on a case-by-case basis.
  6. **Personnel Responsibilities.**
    - a. Management
      - 1) Maintain the range facility.
      - 2) Maintain the Official Range Schedules, to include matches, recreational fire, and any special instructions.
    - b. Shooting Club Members
      - 1) Be familiar with and follow all club rules for range use.
      - 2) All shooters and guests must fill out "hold harmless" agreements.
      - 3) Shooters will conduct themselves in an orderly manner at all times and will be responsible for the conduct of any guests they bring.
      - 4) All shooters are responsible for their guns and ammunition while on the complex.
      - 5) Keep firearms cased until at a firing point. Exempt are CHL holders that carry concealed or active law enforcement officers but the gun must remain in the holster until the shooter is at the firing line.
  7. **Hours of Operation and Scheduling.** The Management develops a special event live-fire schedule based on requests received and posts it monthly, and on the website. All range requests will be approved based on range availability.
  8. **Alcoholic Beverages and Drugs.** Shooters may not consume alcoholic beverages or drugs (including prescription and over-the-counter medications) before or during live firing. The Management will deny range access to anyone in violation.
  9. **Medical Support.** In the event of a medical emergency, call 911 and notify the Management immediately.
  10. **Hold Harmless Agreement Form.** A "hold harmless" agreement form will be completed annually by each club member annually as part of membership renewal. Guests must complete an agreement each time they shoot.

## **Range Qualification and Rules**

### **Indoor Range Qualification**

1. To use the indoor range without the supervision of a Range Safety Officer, members must complete the prescribed course of instruction under the supervision of the Management or a designated NRA Certified Pistol Instructor.
2. The National Rifle Association FIRST STEPS PISTOL course is one of the accepted courses of instruction.
  3. FIRST STEPS PISTOL is normally offered to members and the public on a regular basis as scheduled by Management.
  4. Graduates of the FIRST STEPS PISTOL course who join the club within sixty days need not repeat the course, but must attend Range Orientation before entry to the range.
  5. Satisfactory proficiency in safe gun handling and marksmanship are required prior to range entry.
  6. Other gun safety related classes can be approved by management to substitute the FIRST STEPS PISTOL course but Range Orientation training is mandatory for everybody that wants to use the range without direct supervision.

### **Range Rules**

1. Use of Range- Only members authorized by the Management may use the indoor range without supervision. The range hours of operation will be posted and available on the website.
2. Firearms brought Into the Range: Firearms brought into the range must be completely unloaded. Firearms must be enclosed in a gun case, kit, or box until at an actual firing point, except firearms may be uncased in the cleaning, maintenance, areas. Persons holding a concealed firearm permit, are exempt from this requirement for the firearm they are currently carrying however, they must keep their pistol or revolver holstered until at a firing point. Uncased firearms must ALWAYS be pointed in a safe direction.
3. Firearms Permitted
  - a. All handguns up to .50 caliber, rifles see list of approved calibers.  
Muzzle loaders and weapons that fire black powder cartridges are not allowed.
4. Ammunition Restrictions
  - a. Commercial and reloaded ammunition is permitted.
  - b. The following types of ammunition are prohibited
    - 1) Steel jacketed / metal piercing.
    - 2) Tracer, incendiary, or explosive ammunition.

5. Firing Line Occupants

- a. No eating, smoking, or drinking in the range area.
- b. Handgun shooters under 21 years of age / rifle shooters under 18 years of age must be accompanied by an adult qualified to use the indoor range, acting as a coach, and must remain with the underage shooter at all times. (This does not apply to organized events such as junior / youth rifle.)
- c. Only one shooter or one shooter and one coach are permitted per shooting point, and only one uncased firearm is permitted per point. Range Officers and Instructors may waive this for organized events such as Basic Pistol Shooting classes.
- d. Persons not coaching or shooting are not permitted on the range, except on the observers' benches.
- e. No person shall go forward of the firing line until all firearms are laid on the bench with slides locked back and open, magazines out, cylinders open and shooters away from the bench. Firearms may not be handled while persons are forward of the firing line.

Muzzles must remain pointed downrange at all times.

6. Shooters must load and unload their own firearm. Loaded firearms are not to be passed to another person. Do not change shooting points with a loaded firearm.
8. Only line of sight firing is permitted. So-called Snap shooting, quick draw, hip shooting, etc. are permitted only for specially organized events. No fanning the hammer (machine gun style) is permitted.
9. Only paper and cardboard targets, not to exceed the size of the target carrier may be used. No reactive targets may be used except authorized by management. All target designs have to be approved by range management.
10. Do not shoot forward of the target line. Observe the minimum shooter to target distance published by management. When shooting at less than that distance, too many bullets enter the trap improperly and may damage the ceiling, floor, walls etc. Take special care not to shoot the ceiling.
  - Any shooter that causes damage to the range will be charged for the actual repair costs.
  - Members are responsible for their guests.
7. Turn on the ventilation system prior to shooting. It takes about one minute for the system to become fully operational. After turning off the system, allow one full minute before restarting.
8. Report any damage caused or observed to the RSO or management.
